New executive officer comes aboard

Naval Air Station Key West's new executive officer, Cmdr. Hans Liske, has had a chance to exact some revenge. Not just your ordinary "I've been wronged"-revenge, but real revenge. Revenge against terrorism.

"I had worked for three years at N81, on the OPNAV staff at the Pentagon," said Liske. "I detached from the Pentagon, and 60 days later, the airplane was flown into the Pentagon. The desk I sat at burned up, and a Department of the Navy civilian, Brady Howell, who sat next to me, was killed.

"I was fortunate enough that when I detached, I was assigned to be a department head on the USS John F. Kennedy, and the first

thing we did on deployment was to go to the north Arabian Sea in support of Operation Enduring Freedom, and we arrived during the Battle of Anaconda," he said. "That was very gratifying to be able to strike back at some people who needed striking."

Liske says his participation in that operation was one of the most memorable moments in his career.

Liske was raised in San Antonio, Texas and graduated from the University of Texas - Austin with a bachelor's degree in business administration. He was commissioned in May 1985 from Aviation Officer Candidate School in Pensacola and designated a Naval Aviator in April 1986.

Liske has been stationed with the BATMEN

Myths and misconceptions at the Sigsbee Park gate

Contrary to popular belief, Sigsbee Park is not an "open base," said CMDCM (SW) Kraig Holubar, Naval Air Station Key West command master chief, at a meeting held for NAS section leaders Monday.

"Sigsbee Park is only open to authorized personnel," said Holubar. "It is not open to the general public."

Authorized personnel are listed as: military and NAS employee ID card holders, vehicles with a base sticker or base pass obtained at Boca Chica, validated delivery drivers, and taxis, under certain conditions. Taxis can take an ID card holder to his or her home and pick up a passenger on Sigsbee, but if the passenger in the taxi does not have a valid ID card, the gate guard

will verify the taxi's destination, and then the taxi will be logged into a visitor logbook at the guard shack.

People who do not fall into one of those categories will not be allowed on base without an escort, Holubar said. The gate guard will call the Sigsbee resident when a visitor arrives, and when the resident arrives to escort the visitor, the gate guard will log the visitor into the logbook.

This will provide a record of who is coming on the base, so if something were to happen, an actual person can be identified, said Holubar.

The gate area will also be improved to better protect the gate guard and Sigsbee residents. Plans call for a stop sign or speed bump - or both - to be installed, new lighting to be placed, and a sign telling resi-

Freedom, Liske said he realizes that's why he will be so fanatic about supporting the training of the warfighters that come through NAS Key West.

"What I have to do as the XO here is to make sure that the military organization is organized and functions to efficiently accomplish supporting the warfighter," said Liske. "Embedded in that, not a separate thing, is safety and today, in this environment, security. Those should both be part and parcel of how we do business."

Liske plans on using his career as a Naval officer to help him learn about the ins and outs of being the XO of an NAS.

"Part of the theory of having officer be generalists in different things is to expose you to a broad range of things," he said. "What I have learned from that is that I can't be the expert. The biggest lesson I have learned over time is that I have to find the expert and ask him or her how to do those things and rely on their expertise, whether that be the department head, junior

officer, chief petty officer, and in some cases all the way down to the airman or seaman. If they know what they are doing, and they are telling me this is how we are going to do it, then 'aye, aye.' I will throw my weight as XO behind that person to get the support they need to accomplish the mission."

When not at work, the new XO is an avid reader and runner.

One of the things Liske would like to see happen is the formation of an NAS team for adventure racing in Florida. Adventure racing combines running, swimming, rappelling, mountain biking, and other outdoor sports in a two to three day race that is not for the faint of heart.

Liske says that being physically fit is also part of training warfighters and the teamwork and fitness that comes with adventure racing or any sport can be a benefit to our war readiness.

And that's what this is all about, that's what we are here for, he added.

News from Exotic and Wild Bird Rescue

What's good for the goose?

Continuing their efforts to clean up shoreline wildlife habitats of the Keys, volunteers of Wild Bird Rescue of Big Pine targeted Fleming Key Sunday. They were only mildly surprised to spot the remains of a double crested cormorant soaked with outboard motor oil. Answering their call to Navy dispatch were MA2 Montego McKinnon and Officer Phillip Gaines.

Proceeding with their task, the volunteers collected over 30 bags of marine debris: plastic bags, Styrofoam cups, propane bottles, bleach containers, glass bottles, boards, shoes, car seats, and 16 cans of outboard motor

oil, some with oil still in them. According to the team — EN1 Paul Totman, Faye Daniels, Stuart Garrison and Maya Totman - there is still more trash to be hauled away.

Widespread pollution is badly affecting our oceans today. From paper products to plastics, chemicals to petroleum products, marine pollution is not just ugly, but causes many health problems for the animals that live in the ocean. A number of things can happen when marine life becomes entangled — they can remain permanently entangled, they can injure themselves, their injuries can cause infections, or death strikes because they cannot escape from predators. Entanglement occurs because many animals are naturally curious, and will investigate something new in their environment, like a floating packing strap.

The larger message from this is that our environment and our wildlife are suffering from careless disposal of wastes. Each year, debris is released into the environment and as time goes

on the amount of debris in the marine environment builds up. Once in the marine environment, debris harms both wildlife and people. Marine animals such as fish, dolphins, whales, seals, and birds are harmed because they become entangled or mistake debris for food.

For example, we benefit from synthetic materials, such as plastics, because of their dura-

bility, low cost, and they are lightweight, but unfortunately, these same properties pose problems for the environment. Being extremely stable, they do not readily breakdown but tend to remain in the marine environment for three to five years or more. Most people assume that all debris degrades quickly in the ocean and the problem will just "go away over time" - not true, much of the marine debris per-

sists for many years.

Marine debris often resembles the foods that many animals eat. A plastic bag from your grocery store floating on the sea resembles the jellyfish that are eaten by many species of fish, dolphins, and turtles. Sparking their curiosity, marine animals swallow such debris, which injures them or remains undi-

Fire prevention week starts October 9

And again we arrive at the week of October 9th, Fire Prevention Week.

As you may know, this was started in remembrance of the great Chicago fire as a way for the fire service to teach fire safety to the nation. At first just one day was used, but in 1925 the President of the United States decided that one day was just not enough so the whole week that contains October 9th was set aside for the nation's fire services to teach fire safety. Thus was born what we see today, National Fire Prevention Week. Themes vary from year to year, all revolve around the most important thing, and that is you and your family. You and your families are in fact, the heart and soul of this Naval Air Station and can never be replaced.

This year's theme is again on smoke detectors and the importance of early detection of a fire. Fire codes tell us how they are to be installed and tested, but whom does it fall on to assure your family is safe?

You, you're the deciding factor in your family's fire safety. When you think a fire will never happen to me, or you choose to ignore, or even install that protection, then you place the deciding factor on living or



dying on us, the fire service.

Guys, fires do happen on this installation. We have been lucky, as no one has died yet but military members have been hurt, some rather badly and firefighters have been hurt. Military families have lost everything they own. I have been on the job here 20 years, I have seen a lot. I have seen what happens when it goes right and though there was a fire, no one was hurt. I have seen a small child loaded into a life flight helicopter to be flown to a Tampa burn center. So what is the common factor of all these fires? The human factor, what was done, what should have been done to prevent the fire and to give early warning in a fire.

Do you, as you read this, even know if you have a working smoke detector in your house? If they are there, have they been cleaned, tested, or have you ever practiced a fire evacuation drill in your home? Now when the wife is in the shower, though funny, it's not the time to set off your smoke detector, scream FIRE! and stand in the hall with a camera. But would your family know what to do at 3 a.m.

when the detector sounds an alarm?

Ladder 49 was a good movie; I grew up in Baltimore and was a firefighter up there so it was for me, like going home. Still the fire scenes are not what a working fire is like. It is hot, blinding, and deadly in a matter of seconds.

So let's all go home make sure that first, we have smoke detectors properly installed and that they do work. Let's keep them clean, as you clean your house just vacuum out the detector at least once a month. If you don't have one then open the cover and use a clean brush to dust it out and push the test button, make sure it sounds loud and clear. Battery smoke detectors need to have the battery replaced every six months.

The simple plain statistical fact year in, year out, is that in your own home, on a week-night, between midnight and 4 a.m., you're most likely to die in a fire. Every year roughly 3,000 Americans die in home fires and 25 percent are children under the age of 5. Some of us die to trying to save you. We don't see ourselves as heroes. Most firemen I have known are in fact men, living a little boy's dream. We run in when others run out. So let's check our smoke detectors, let's practice an evacuation plan so that all my brothers come home to their families at the end of the shift. Stay safe!

gested giving them a false sense of being full so they will not eat enough food. Plastic pellets are often found in birds' gizzards and stomachs.

Floating balloons look like jellyfish or other tasty food, but the rubbers and attached string can block the intestines of marine mammals. Styrofoam takes many years to break down in the sea and can cause intestinal blockage if swallowed by marine mammals. Plastic pellets resemble fish eggs and sea birds will eat them.

Plastic six-pack rings for beverages, balloons, plastic straws

and Styrofoam can be deadly to marine mammals and other marine animals. Plastic six-pack rings are almost invisible underwater, so animals cannot avoid them. They often get caught around their necks and strangle or suffocate them.

Discarded fishing line can entangle animals, causing injury or death. For dolphins, fishing line can wrap around a flipper or tail fluke and, over time, cut through the fin.

Fatman, an adult male at Dolphin Encounters, is easily recognized by the missing portion of his dorsal fin — a suspected injury from entanglement many years ago in the wild.

Just like it is for us, swimming

in chemicals, gas or oil can make marine animals very sick and can even be fatal. Fuel spills from boats are just as harmful as run-off of chemicals from the land - such as fertilizers, gas and oil, anti-freeze or bleach.

Marine debris is an ugly problem and often life threatening for many forms of marine life. It's up to us to prevent trash from making it to the ocean and to share that message in our own communities.


