

1. Curriculum Number: 974
2. The curriculum is taught at the following Civilian Institutions:
 - a. Duke Divinity School
 - b. Princeton Theological Seminary
 - c. Trinity Evangelical Divinity School
3. Students are fully funded.
4. Curriculum length in months: 9-12
5. The major area sponsor will coordinate with the Chaplain Corps Officer Community Manager and Budget Submitting Offices to allow billets to be coded for Religion in Culture/973 and officers to be educated for this curriculum.
6. The officer will be expected to:
 - a. Understand and communicate factors in and contributors to stress experienced by service members and their families in areas including pre-deployment, post-deployment, and during deployment, as well as, adjusting to life in the military, strains on marriage and parenting, among others.
 - b. Understand how personality develops and the part it plays in counseling.
 - c. Understand and show facility in navigating group dynamics.
 - d. Gain requisite skills in interpersonal counseling for the following demographic groups within a command, including but not limited to:
