

PERS-431 2016-2017 NROTC XO ROE

This document provides basic information for NROTC XO fills during late 2016 and summer 2017.

SELECTION BOARD

Due to the distribution of ROTC XO opportunities, the selection process will be split into two boards. The selection board will be headed by the PERS-431 detailers and membership shall consist of the O-5 aviation detailers as well as all available PERS-43 CDRs. The goal of the board is to select the best and most fully qualified officers via a fair and consistent process.

REQUIREMENTS

- Must be wearing O-5 // PRD within NPC policy constraints // O-5 sea duty complete
- Must satisfy the academic standards required by that particular institution

HOW TO APPLY

- Inform your detailer which universities you are interested in, ranked in order. You will only be considered for institutions you rank. It is permissible to list anywhere from one school to all of them.
- Email your detailer a PDF of your transcripts, current photo and career bio to be used by the board and, if selected, by the Naval Service Training Command (NSTC) staff as well as the university.

NOTES:

1. San Diego NROTC is a 'consortium' of multiple universities.
2. Please direct questions to your detailer via contact info on the NPC website.
3. If selected for a billet and approved by the university, you are obligated to fulfill the commitment.
4. There may be additional 'pop-up' opportunities throughout the year should a ROTC unit experience an unplanned loss or another community (SWO, subs, USMC) be unable to fill one of their assigned billets. Due to time constraints these will typically be advertised and detailed as normal billets to qualified officers.
5. Must hold an advanced degree in the appropriate discipline or professional field or be admissible to a University of Minnesota post-baccalaureate program for study in the appropriate field or discipline.
